

Florida Social Studies Standards Addressed By The CHOICES Program Grades 9-12

The terms in italics after a standard refer to Choices units that address that standard.

TIME, CONTINUITY, AND CHANGE [History]

Standard 3:

The student understands Western and Eastern civilization since the Renaissance. (SS.A.3.4)

3. understands the significant economic, political, and cultural interactions among the peoples of Africa, Europe, Asia, and the Americas during the Age of Discovery and the European expansion. (*Congo*)
9. analyzes major historical events of the first half of the 20th century. (*Genocide, Russian Revolution, Weimar & Rise of Hitler, Wilson & League*)
10. understands the political, military, and economic events since the 1950s that have had a significant impact on international relations. (*Genocide, United Nations, Charting Russia's Future, Terrorism*)

Standard 4:

The student understands U.S. history to 1880. (SS.A.4.4)

2. understands how religious, social, political, and economic developments shaped the settlement patterns of the North American colonies. (*Slavery & Slave Trade*)
3. understands the significant military and political events that took place during the American Revolution. (*More Perfect Union*)
4. understands the political events that defined the Constitutional period. (*More Perfect Union*)
5. understands the significant political events that took place during the early national period. (*Challenges to New Republic*)

Standard 5:

The student understands U.S. history from 1880 to the present day. (SS.A.5.4)

2. understands the social and cultural impact of immigrant groups and individuals on American society after 1880. (*Immigration*)
3. understands significant events leading up to the United States involvement in World War I and the political, social, and economic results of that conflict in Europe and the United States. (*Wilson & League*)
5. knows the origins and effects of the involvement of the United States in World War II. (*FDR & Isolationism, Atomic Bomb*)

6. understands the political events that shaped the development of United States foreign policy since World War II and knows the characteristics of that policy. (*Cold War, Cuba, Vietnam, Russia's Uncertain Transition, China, Terrorism*)

PEOPLE, PLACES, AND ENVIRONMENTS

[Geography]

Standard 2:

The student understands the interactions of people and the physical environment. (SS.B.2.4)

4. understands the global impact of human changes in the physical environment. (*Global Environment*)

[Economics]

6. understands factors that have led to increased international interdependence and basic concepts associated with trade between nations. (*Trade*)
