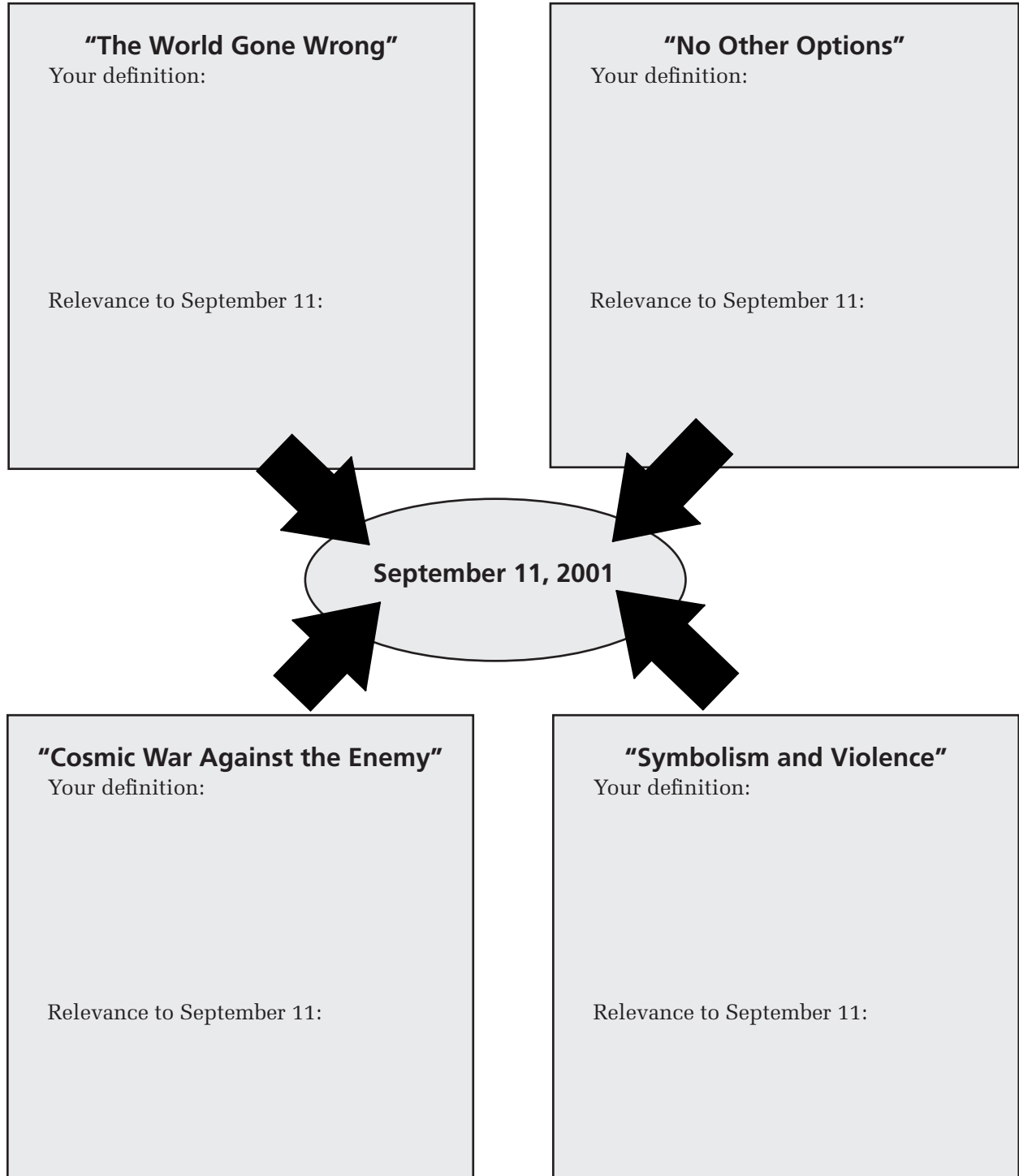

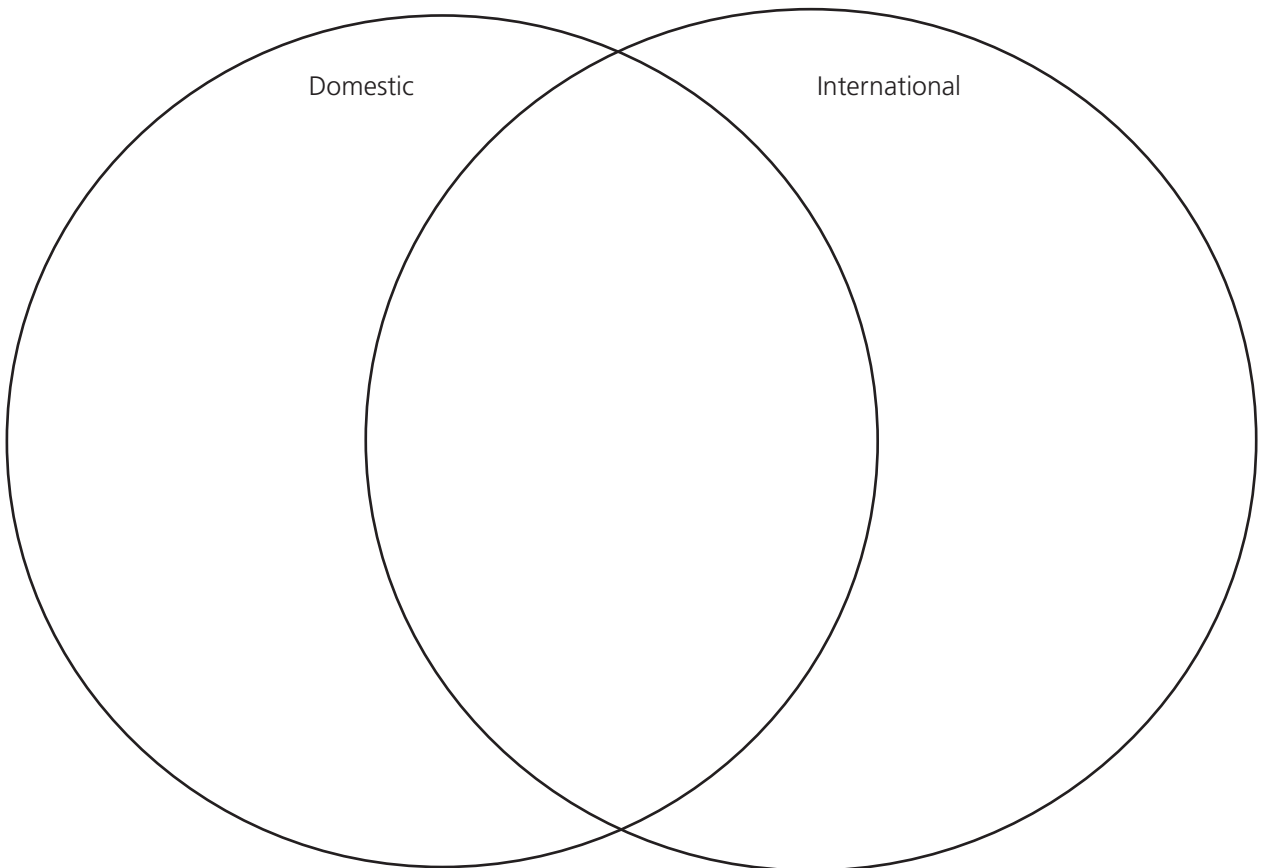

Threats from Terrorism

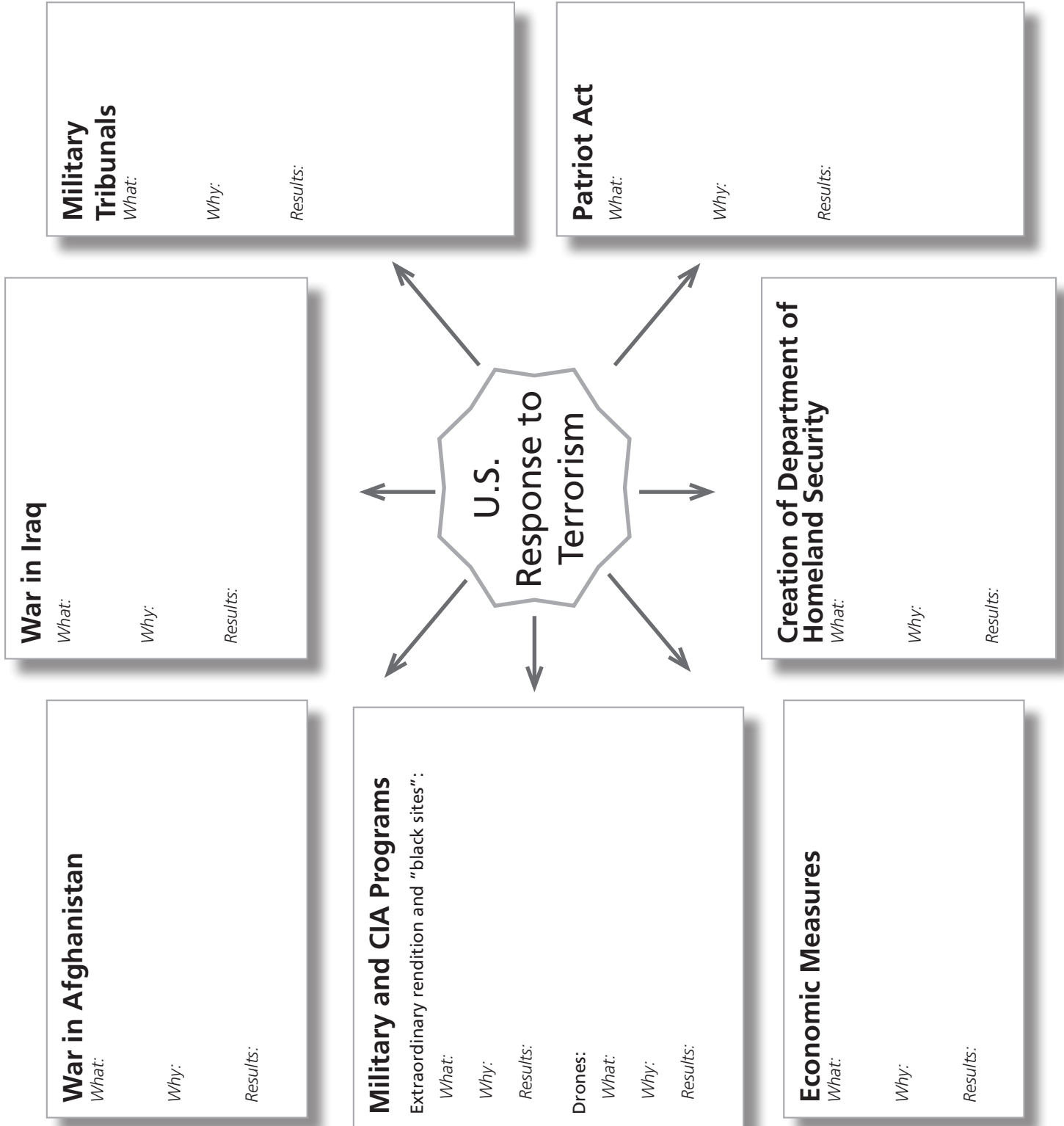
