

Refugee and IDP Data—2016

At the end of 2016, **65.6 million** people had been forcibly displaced from their homes:

40.3 million internally displaced people + **22.5 million** refugees + **2.8 million** asylum seekers = **1 out of 113** people worldwide

There are more displaced people today than at any time since World War II.

Spotlight: The Syrian Civil War

Since 2011, of Syria's population of 22 million:

More than HALF of all Syrians have left their homes:



1 million Syrians



nearly 6 million fled the country

more than 6 million internally displaced

about 10 million not displaced

Syrian Refugees

- 1 in 4 refugees worldwide are Syrian
- 87% of Syrian refugees live in Syria's neighboring countries

- about 400,000 killed
- over 1 million injured
