

Genocidal Acts of the Twentieth and Twenty-First Centuries

1. 1904-1907 Hereros of Southwest Africa: 65,000 out of 80,000 killed by the German government.

2. Ottoman Empire:
1914-1920 Assyrians: 270,000-750,000 killed.
1914-1923 Pontian Greeks: 300,000-750,000 killed.
1915-1922 Armenians: 1,500,000 killed.

3. 1918-1921 Jews living in Ukraine: 100,000-250,000 killed in Pogroms.

4. 1932-1933 USSR: 7,000,000-11,000,000 killed by famine imposed by Stalin's government.

5. 1936-1939 Political dissenters in the USSR: 400,000-500,000 killed.

6. 1939-1945 Europe: 6,000,000 Jews and 6,000,000 others including **Jehovah's Witnesses, Romanians, people with disabilities, and Slavs** killed by the Nazi German government.

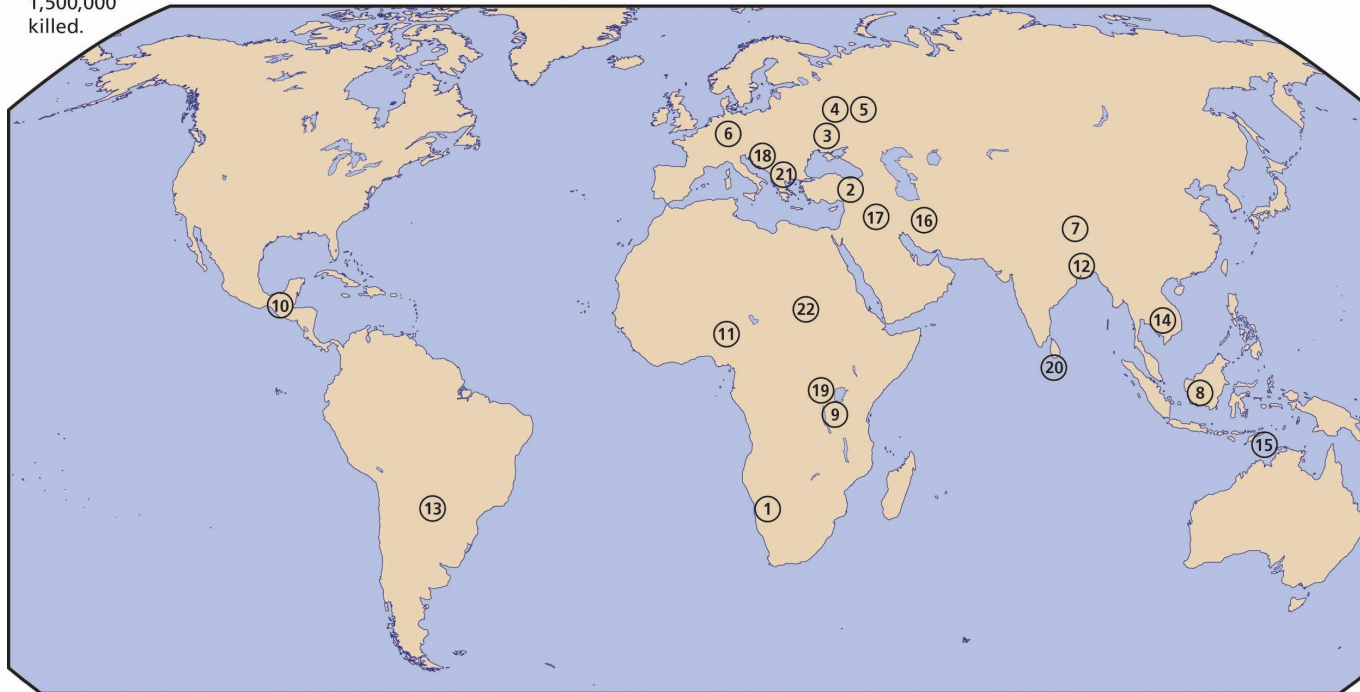
7. 1950-1959 Tibetan Buddhists: unknown number killed by Chinese government.

8. 1965-1966 Communists in Indonesia: 600,000 political opponents killed by Indonesian government.

9. 1965-1972 Hutus of Burundi: 100,000-300,000 killed by the Tutsi.

10. 1965-1996 Guatemalan Indians: unknown number killed by government troops.

11. 1967-1970 Igbo people of North Nigeria: unknown number killed by government troops.



12. 1971 Bengalis in East Pakistan (now Bangladesh): 1,000,000-3,000,000 killed by government.

13. 1972 Ache Indians of Paraguay: unknown number killed by government.

14. 1975-1979 Cambodians: 1,700,000-1,900,000 killed by the Khmer Rouge government.

15. 1995-2000 Citizens of East Timor: 100,000 killed by Indonesian troops.

16. 1980-present Baha'i in Iran: unknown number killed by government.

17. 1986-2003 Kurds in Iraq: unknown number killed by government.

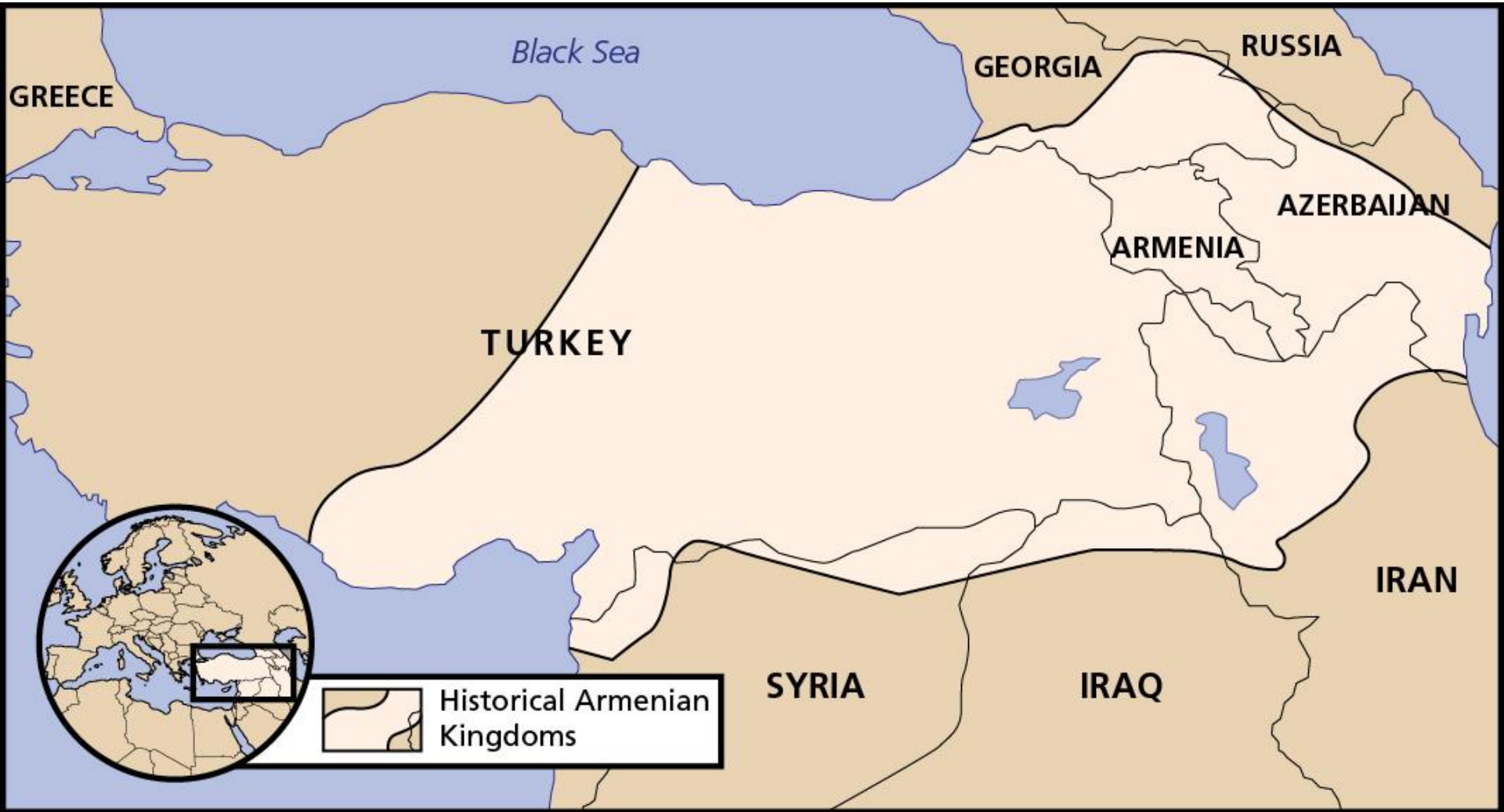
18. 1992-1998 Muslims of Bosnia: 200,000 killed by Croats and Serbs.

19. 1994 Tutsis of Rwanda: 800,000 killed by Hutus.

20. 1995-2009 Tamils: 20,000-100,000 killed by Sri Lankan government.

21. 1998 Albanians in Kosovo: 11,000 killed by Serbs.

22. Sudan:
1980s-present Nuba Mountains: unknown number killed by government and militia groups.
2003-2005 Darfur: 200,000 killed by government and militia groups.
